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1. Introduction to WCET Festival 2019

What is WCET Festival?

In June each year, Suffolk County Music Service (SCMS) presents a week-long festival of music making. The schools involved are those who have Key Stage 2 classes taking part in the Music Service's Whole Class Ensemble Teaching (WCET) programme.

The event is designed to enable pupils to play and sing with other pupils and to experience playing in a bigger ensemble than they would within their own classroom. It allows children to see and listen to instruments from different instrumental families than the ones they have been learning, possibly instruments they might one day want to play. It also gives them the experience of playing and singing with a live band of professional musicians and to celebrate their achievements over the year with performances to family and friends at the end of the afternoon.

We aim to make this a truly memorable musical experience that inspires our pupils to continue making music throughout their lives.

This year, the 'WCET Festival' will see over 3,500 children from 90 primary schools taking part in 15 events across Suffolk.

What do schools take part in at each event?

Throughout the morning, schools will take part in instrumental/vocal rehearsals with SCMS tutors and will learn how to work as part of a large ensemble, following a conductor just as a professional orchestra would.

There are five pieces of pre-rehearsed repertoire this year, each one incorporating a mixture of playing and singing/rapping/beatboxing. Each of the five pieces has been specially arranged by a member of our staff for beginner standard players to work together as a large ensemble and experience playing as part of an orchestra.

The children have been working with their SCMS tutors in school over the last few months, learning to play and sing the pieces by heart so that they can do their very best performance/s each day.
