Workshop outline and learning objectives

Overall aims / learning objectives:

- Participants learn and play as a band simple ceilidh folk tunes arranged for young players from First Access instrumental programmes upwards
- Differentiation possibilities highlighted for players of different levels of experience / skill
- Participants have the opportunity to learn accompanying dances
- Participants have an experience of learning and playing by ear
- Gain an understanding of folk music 'style' individual style, ornamentation, drive etc
- Gain an understanding of the interrelatedness of ceilidh tunes and dances

Donkey Riding

Tune (traditional)



Dance to the tune of DONKEY RIDING

Formation: lines facing away from the band, standing next to your partner- doesn't really matter how many in a line

Musical section	Bars	Dance instructions
A1	1 - 8	8 steps away from the band, kick balance x4
A2	1 - 8	8 steps towards the band; kick balance x4
B1	1 - 4	Right hand turn
	5 – 8	Left hand turn
B2	1 – 4	Back to back (passing right shoulders first)
	5 – 8	Back to back (passing left shoulders first)

Buttered Peas

Tune (traditional)



Dance to the tune of BUTTERED PEAS

From the Yorkshire Dales

Form: Circles of four (two x two pairs) scattered round the space (or Sicillian circle)

Dance step: walk or polka / 'rant' step, or other that fits the rhythm

Musical section	Bars	Dance instructions
A1	1 - 8	Circle left and right
A2	1 - 4	Right hand star (thumbs up)
	5 - 8	Left hand star (thumbs up)
B1	1 - 2	Opposites shake right hands, clap hands x 3
	3 - 4	Repeat with left hands
	5 - 6	Arm right with opposite
	7 - 8	Arm left with opposite
B2	1 – 2	Partners shake right hands, clap hands x 3
	3 - 4	Repeat with left hands
	5 – 8	Partners cross hands swing (optional swing on to find a new pair)

Buttered Peas on the EFDSS Resource Bank

A commonly known folk tune, often used for country dancing, arranged by Sheena Masson from Camden Music Service for Key Stage 1 and 2 pupils in Camden. The pack features separate parts for a range of instruments as well as a full instrumental score.
