

and doing your very best you will be a success.



Music Theory

Tempo Markings

Adagio - slow and stately

Alla marcia - like a march

Allargando – getting slower and broader, more majestic

Allegretto - moderately fast

Allegro - fast and bright

Allegro grazioso - fast and gracefully

Allegro maestoso – fast and majestically

Andante - at walking speed

Andante cantabile – moderate, in a smooth singing style

Allegro non troppo – not too fast

Cantabile - in a smooth singing style

Con molto fuoco - very fiery

Lento - slowly

Piu lento - slower

Maestoso - majestically

Moderato - moderately

Moderato con moto – moderately with movement

Poco lento e grazioso – more slowly and gracefully

Presto - extremely fast

Tempo giusto - in exact time

Vivace - lively and fast

Tempo Changes

rall. – rallentando – gradually slowing down rit. – ritenuto or ritardando – slightly slower poco rit. – a little slower

a tempo - in time (or return to the original speed)



fermata - pause on this note

Dynamic Markings

dim. - diminuendo - gradually softer

cresc. - crescendo - gradually louder

cresc. poco a poco al fine – gradually louder towards the end

pp - pianissimo - very softly

p - piano - softly

mp - mezzo piano - moderately soft

mf - mezzo forte - moderately loud

f – forte – loud

ff - fortissimo - very loud

sf or sfz - sforzando - suddenly with force

subito - suddenly

dolce - sweetly



D.C. al Coda – return to the beginning and follow signs to Coda ♦


D.C. al Fine – return to the beginning and play to Fine




