Introduction

It is with great pleasure that we offer this short summary of our plan to perform Mahler's transcendentally beautiful *Symphony No. 6 "The Tragic"* and Stravinsky's *Symphony of Psalms* at Royal Festival Hall in 2019.

Because of the gargantuan scale of Mahler's symphonic works, few pupils (even those who go on to become professional musicians) will ever have the opportunity to perform them. Indeed, because of their prohibitive scale, few will even have the opportunity of hearing them at a live concert, so over-subscribed are those rare performances.

We are delighted to announce, however that, after exhaustive national auditions, we are combining the orchestral forces of 20 leading independent schools to form a superlative ensemble of around 150 orchestral musicians and 100 choral singers who will come together in April 2019 as a team to enjoy this lifetime experience that no pupil will ever forget.

We have chosen these masterpieces to celebrate the excellence in music that the individual schools have achieved whilst offering pupils and parents an experience that will last in their memories forever – not least because of the extraordinary privilege of performing these monumental masterpieces at Royal Festival Hall with an internationally-renowned conductor.

In this short booklet we have set out a summary of the plans, the support needed from parents, and details of how to secure your tickets for the performance.

Our music director and chief conductor who will rehearse the orchestra then conduct the entire ensemble in performance. Ronald will be assisted by the music directors from each of the member schools.

Wellington College

The staff at Wellington College will be supplying all boarding, dining, leisure, and rehearsal facilities.

Duet Foundation

This is the charity which is organising all aspects of the residential course, the rehearsals, and the performance, and underwriting all contractual costs and liabilities. The Duet Philharmonic is the orchestral wing of the foundation.

What is involved?

- A preliminary day of read-through rehearsals at Kings Place Music Foundation, London, on Friday 22nd Feb 2019.
- A five-day residential course from Wednesday 3rd to Sunday 7th April 2019 of "full" rehearsals at Wellington College, including evening entertainment, leisure facilities, and full board.
- Final rehearsals and evening performance at Royal Festival Hall, London on Monday 8th April 2019.
- Sectional rehearsals and masterclasses by professional musicians.
- An essay competition open to all students of the participating schools resulting in publication of the two winners and a public prize ceremony at Royal Festival Hall (see page 11).
- A professional recording of the performance and a DVD documentary of the rehearsals and performance.
- Commemorative medals for all pupils and Duet Philharmonic livery uniform.

Please note that any and all rights associated with the recording and/or filming of the Mahler concert and rehearsals is retained exclusively by the Duet Foundation (charity number 1153379) or its assignees.

The residential course

- Set in the beautiful grounds of Wellington College near Crowthorne in Berkshire, the course commences for orchestral musicians at 12pm on Wednesday 3rd April and for choral singers at 12pm on Saturday 6th April 2019.
- On arrival the pupils will be given lunch and taken to their boarding houses to unpack and prepare for afternoon rehearsals.
- Each evening after dinner, entertainment will be provided including a cinema film.
- The pupils will work in three sessions each day in activities including masterclasses, sectional rehearsals, and full-forces rehearsals.
- The pupils are at liberty to enjoy the leisure facilities at Wellington during their free time and quiet study areas will be made available for students wishing to revise and prepare for summer examinations.
- On Monday 8th April, the pupils will travel by coach from Wellington to Royal Festival Hall where they will have their final rehearsals as well as lunch and tea.
- All students **must** bring and wear **tailored black trousers** at the concert and a Duet Philharmonic liveried shirt/blouse (included in course fees).
- The performance will commence at 7.30pm on Monday 8th April after a short prize-giving for the essay competition winners.
- Parents will collect their children after the concert.

The cost of the course and concert

The cost per pupil is £485 (orchestral musicians) and £245 (choral singers)

Tickets for parents and friends

- Royal Festival Hall has an audience capacity of 2,300 which means tickets are very limited and we apologise in advance for any disappointment this may cause.
- Following earlier performances by the Duet Philharmonic, the orchestra is now regarded as one of the best youth orchestras in the world; so much so that, for the 2019 Mahler concert, the Duet Philharmonic has, once again, been invited by Royal Festival Hall to perform as a public concert (as opposed to private hire).
- Competition for places in the Duet Philharmonic has been fierce and only the very best students from the auditioning schools have gained their very well-deserved places.
- The quality of the orchestra, coupled with the excitement of listening to Mahler's *Symphony No.6* and Stravinsky's *Symphony of Psalms* in the same concert, means that tickets, which are now available, are likely to sell out very fast.

The essay competition

The purpose of the competition is to explore the student's research expertise, knowledge, and communication skills. The competition is open to all pupils of the schools participating in the Mahler project. The directors of music of the 20 participating schools will judge which of their students' essays will be submitted into the final round. A panel will then decide on the two winners (one winner per essay). Those winners will have their essays published in the programme for the Mahler concert and will be awarded a prize of £250 each at a public prize-giving at Royal Festival Hall.

Students are encouraged to make reference to music scores (quoting episodes where appropriate) and collateral source materials relating to music influences and the artistic and political environment. The essays are distinct from one another and will stand alone as items in the concert programme. Therefore, students are encouraged not to cross-contaminate the subject matter of the two questions.

Students may submit an essay to one or both of the questions (circa 2,000 words per essay). The deadline for submissions is Tuesday 18th December 2018.

Essay No 1

Discuss Mahler's use of dramatic contrasts in his *Symphony No. 6* and how drama becomes an integral component of symphonic form.

Essay No 2

Stravinsky was surprisingly religious. How is Stravinsky's personal interpretation of his religion expressed in the *Symphony of Psalms*? What specific devices does Stravinsky employ to express the symphony's religious qualities?
