Lancashire Music Service are seeking instrumental teachers in all disciplines, (especially Strings and Woodwind) including Music Technology to teach 1-1, group and whole class lessons across the county. LMS has been established for over 60 years and is the current lead partner for Lancashire Music Education Hub, we deliver tuition to over 20,000 pupils per week in a variety of settings.

We have an extremely high demand for lessons across the county, and aim to inspire pupils of all ages to develop a love of music making. These lessons form part of our progression strategy from Whole Class Instrumental Tuition, into 1-1 or group lessons and onto playing with one of our County Ensembles or music centre groups.

Key Information

- This is a self-employed role
- Lessons can be between 20 minutes and an hour (small group lessons will be a maximum of 4 pupils in a half an hour slot)
- They may take place in a school during the day, at one of our Music Centres in the evening or when attached to a County Ensemble at the weekend
- There are 34 lessons delivered over the course of an academic year
- Teachers are paid between £25.20 and £28 per hour, depending on the lesson type
- You may teach at several schools in one day

Other information

Full training and induction will be given upon appointment. You will also be given an iPad on long term loan, any resources that you might need (including instruments and music technology equipment e.g. Ableton Push2), access to Charanga Professional to use as a resource, and ongoing CPD and support. This is a self-employed role, but most of the administration is handled by our business support team. You may also be offered 1-1 or small group teaching as well as WCIT teaching in your role as an LMS teacher. We welcome applications from a diverse range of backgrounds and experiences to enrich our team.
